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**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act supporting seniors' financial stability.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 10, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 78 the following section:-

3 Section 79. The office of the state treasurer shall develop and periodically review and
4 update model curriculum to support seniors' financial literacy and stability, in consultation with
5 the executive office of elder affairs, the Massachusetts Councils on Aging and AARP
6 Massachusetts.
