An Act relative to littering.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after Section 22G the following section:-

3           Section 22G 1/2. No operator of a motor vehicle shall litter, or knowingly permit an  
4 occupant of their vehicle to litter on public or private property through the disposal of trash or  
5 garbage from said motor vehicle. A violation of this section shall be considered a civil motor  
6 vehicle infraction and shall be punishable by a civil citation issued pursuant to chapter 90C,  
7 which shall include a fine of \$100 for a first offense, \$250 for a second offense, and \$500 for a  
8 third or subsequent offense. A civil citation issued for a third or subsequent offense shall be  
9 considered a surchargeable offense under Section 113B of Chapter 175.

10          SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
