HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, February 9, 2026.

The committee on Financial Services, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1118) of Mark J. Cusack that health insurance plans be authorized to ensure adequate staffing during evenings, weekends, and holidays; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1120) of Mark J. Cusack relative to patient access to primary care services; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1156) of Carole A. Fiola for legislation to require certain healthcare carriers to share accountability with providers for uncollectible patient obligations after insurance; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1196) of Steven S. Howitt relative to unpaid health insurance deductibles; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1210) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others relative to artificial intelligence health communications and informed patient consent; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1255) of Christopher M. Markey and others relative to patient care; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1320) of Margaret R. Scarsdale relative to the preauthorization process for certain health care services; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1375) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others for legislation to establish a special commission (including members of the General Court) to consider and evaluate the efficacy of policies that require hospitals and other health care providers to sell bundled packages of services that include fees for all relevant physicians, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5066) ought to be adopted.

1           *Ordered,* That the committee on Financial Services be authorized to sit during a recess of  
2 the General Court to make an investigation and study of House documents numbered 1118,  
3 1120, 1156, 1196, 1210, 1255, 1320 and 1375, relative to health insurance contracting matters.

4           Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study  
5 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
6 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
7 on or before December 31, 2026.
