**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court  
(2025-2026)**

## An Act supporting the development of children experiencing homelessness.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2024 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by adding after section 248 the following section:-  
3 Section 249. Upon a family's entry to a temporary emergency assistance shelter, domestic  
4 violence shelter, substance abuse and recovery shelter or non-emergency assistance shelter,  
5 children ages zero to three years shall be automatically referred for early intervention assessment  
6 within thirty (30) days of entry into shelter, according to department of public health operational  
7 standards. Early intervention services shall be rendered once an evaluation and determination of  
8 need has been established by an early intervention professional.  
9 SECTION 2. The department shall adopt regulations or policies and remove procedural barriers  
10 for the administration of this act within 120 days of the effective date of this act.
