1 *Ordered,* That the committee on Economic Development and Emerging Technologies be
2 authorized to sit during a recess of the General Court to make an investigation and study of
3 House documents numbered 479, 482, 484, 486, 487, 493, 494, 495, 500, 501, 502 and 503,
4 relative to limited liability companies, businesses, small businesses, municipal and regional
5 development, trade commissions and artificial intelligence.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
7 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
8 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
9 on or before December 31, 2026.
