Pease relative to state funded construction work; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3971) of Dennis C. Gallagher for an investigation by a special legislative commission (including members of the General Court) to study the feasibility and efficacy of placing the registries of deeds for county governments under the oversight of the State Secretary, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5184) ought to be adopted.

4 3379, 3401 and 3971, relative to state properties, public officials and employees, construction,
5 lobbying and other related issues.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
7 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
8 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
9 on or before December 31, 2026.
