The committee on Financial Services, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1169) of Colleen M. Garry relative to colon cancer under the age of 50 years of age, prevalence, screening and insurance coverage and care; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1216) of Kristin E. Kassner and others relative to insurance coverage of hearing aids; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1286) of Edward R. Philips relative to insurance coverage for colorectal cancer screenings and breast cancer screenings; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1297) of David Allen Robertson relative to co-payments, deductibles, coinsurance or other cost-sharing requirements for colon screenings; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1308) of Lindsay N. Sabadosa, Natalie M. Higgins and others relative to health insurance coverage for voluntary female sterilization; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4014) of Carmine Lawrence Gentile relative to insurance coverage for pharmacists providing opioid use disorder treatment, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5210) ought to be adopted.
