4 3845, 3846, 3847, 3850, 3852, 3854, 3856, 3857, 3858, 3859, 3861, 3863, 3864, 3865, 3866,
5 3868, 3870, 3872, 3874, 3875, 3876, 3877, 3879, 3880, 3881, 3882, 3883, 3884, 3885, 3887,
6 3889, 4002 and 4479, relative to veterans' benefits, prisoners of war, federal constitutional
7 convention and other veterans and federal affairs issues.

8 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
9 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
10 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
11 on or before December 31, 2026.
