An Act to charter school renewals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 89 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as so appearing in the 2022 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following after the second paragraph of subsection
3 (dd) :

4 The board shall also consider evidence of inequitable disciplinary practices and culturally
5 insensitive policies. The board may also consider any other relative information that in its
6 judgement negatively impacts students outcomes.
