In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act establishing the Massachusetts School Safety Data Grant Program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 147 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after Section 63 the
2	following section:

- 3 Section 64: Massachusetts School Safety Data Grant Program
- 4 (a) Definitions

5 As used in this section, the following words shall have the following meanings unless the

- 6 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 7 1. "Office", The Executive Office of Public Safety and Security
- 8 2. "Program", the Massachusetts School Safety Data Grant Program
- 9 3. "Public safety agencies", any municipal, county, regional, or state agency

10 responsible for providing emergency services, including law enforcement, fire departments,

11 emergency medical services.

4. "School", any public or private primary or secondary educational institution,
 including charter schools, vocational schools, and special education schools approved under Ch.
 71B.

- 5. "School mapping data", detailed and verified geographical and structural data of
 school buildings and grounds, including but not limited to floor plans, aerial imagery, and sitespecific labels identifying rooms, hallways, stairwells, and emergency resources.
- 6. "Software platforms", the digital tools and systems used by public safety agencies
 to access, share, and utilize mapping data and related emergency information.

7. "Verified", data that has been physically inspected and confirmed for accuracy
through an on-site review of the school buildings and grounds by the entity responsible for
producing the school mapping data.

23 (b) Establishment of Program

24 To facilitate efficient and effective emergency response by law enforcement and public 25 safety agencies across the Commonwealth, the Massachusetts School Safety Data Grant Program 26 is hereby established within the Office. The Office shall, subject to appropriation, administer a 27 program to provide grants to municipal, county, regional, or state law enforcement agencies for 28 the purpose of developing standardized school mapping data to establish a single, verified source 29 of school mapping data for each school in the Commonwealth, ensuring that such data is 30 accurate, standardized, and accessible to public safety agencies statewide to facilitate efficient emergency response on school campuses. A municipal, county, regional, or state law 31 32 enforcement agency may apply for a grant to provide school mapping data for one or more 33 schools, provided the agency has jurisdiction over the respective school or schools.

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34	(c) Requirements for School Safety Mapping Data		
35	The school mapping data shall adhere to the following criteria:		
36	1. The data shall:		
37	1. conform to and integrate with software platforms used by municipal, state, and		
38	federal public safety agencies responsible for emergency services at the school without requiring		
39	the purchase of additional software or payment of fees to access the data. Future updates or		
40	modifications to the school mapping data must conform to and integrate with all software		
41	platforms used by the relevant public safety agencies;		
42	2. conform to and integrate with safety and emergency software platforms used by		
43	the school without requiring the purchase of additional software or payment of fees to access the		
44	data;		
45	3. be provided in a printable format;		
46	4. be oriented true north, include a grid with "x" and "y" coordinates for reference,		
47	and include z-axis elevation data for each floor;		
48	5. have its accuracy verified by the entity producing the data through an on-site		
49	walk-through of the school buildings and grounds;		
50	6. include accurate floor plans overlaid on current, verified aerial imagery of the		
51	school campus;		
52	7. include site-specific labeling for school structures such as room names, hallway		
53	designations, exterior doors, stairwell numbers, and the locations of hazards, critical utility		

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54	controls, key boxes, automated external defibrillators, and trauma kits and school grounds,
55	including parking areas, athletic fields, surrounding roads, and neighboring properties; and
56	8. provided to the school district and appropriate public safety agencies at no cost
57	beyond the initial cost of production and shall be made available to such entities permanently.
58	(d) Regulations
59	The Office shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions

60 of this section and ensure compliance with the requirements of the Program.
