In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act to prohibit the sale of "energy drinks" to persons under the age of 18.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Chapter 270 of the General Laws,	as appearing in the	2014 Official	Edition, is	hereby
2	amended by adding Section 30:				

3 Section 30: Whoever distributes, delivers, gives away or sells, any packaged "Energy" 4 Drink" or other ingredient, substance or beverage that exceeds a caffeine content of seventy-one 5 (71) milligrams per twelve (12) ounce serving and contains taurine and glucuronolactone or a 6 packaged soft drink that is classified as a dietary supplement not regulated by the Food and Drug 7 Administration and that contains eighty (80) or more milligrams of caffeine per eight (8) fluid 8 ounces and generally includes a combination of methylxanthines, B vitamins and herbal 9 ingredients which are advertised as being specifically designed to provide or increase energy to any persons under the age of eighteen (18) shall be punished by a fine not less than fifty (50) 10 11 dollars for the first offense, one hundred (100) for the second offense and two hundred fifty 12 (250) for the third offense.
