**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court  
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to governmental and charitable tort liability.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 85K of chapter 231 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “shall not exceed the sum of  
3 \$100,000, exclusive of interests and costs” the following:- “provided, however, that all claims of  
4 sexual abuse of a minor, as defined in section 4C of chapter 260, shall not be subject to a  
5 limitation on damages”

6 SECTION 2. Section 2 of chapter 258 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020  
7 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words “the Massachusetts Bay  
8 Transportation Authority shall not be subject to a \$100,000 limitation on compensatory  
9 damages” the following:- “; provided further that all claims of sexual abuse of a minor, as  
10 defined in section 4C of chapter 260, shall not be subject to a \$100,000 limitation on damages”

11           SECTION 3. Subsection (j) of section 10 of said chapter 258 is hereby amended by  
12 inserting, after paragraph (4), the following paragraph:- “(5) any claim of sexual abuse of a  
13 minor, as defined in section 4C of chapter 260, by a public employee or contractor.”
