In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act relative to treatment for substance use disorder.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Section 51 ½ of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking subsection (d) in its entirety and inserting the

3 following thereof:-

(d) If a person has received a substance abuse evaluation and returns to an acute care
hospital or emergency satellite facility within seven days of receipt of such evaluation suffering
from an opiate-related overdose or has recently been administered naloxone, the attending
physician may authorize the restraint of such person and apply for the treatment of such person
for a 3-day period at a facility authorized for such purposes by the department of public health or
the department of mental health.
