### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act relative to the return of firearms.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 140 of the general laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 123 the
- 2 following new section:-
- 3 "Section 123A. Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary,
- 4 any person having temporarily stored a weapon with a private business including, but not limited
- 5 to, a licensed retailer under section 123 or a bonded warehouse under section 129D shall be
- 6 entitled to the return of their property.
- 7 If in the event that said property was transferred to and stored by a private business
- 8 without the expressed written consent of the property owner, no fees may be charged as a
- 9 requirement for the return of said property.

Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary, any person having temporarily transferred a weapon to a private business including, but not limited to, a licensed retailer under section 123 or a gunsmith for, but not limited to, repair, modification, warranty work, replacement or maintenance shall be entitled to the return of their property."
