**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court  
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to fire safety education in schools and colleges.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 47 the following section:-

3 Section 48. Establishment of a fire safety curriculum. (a) For the purposes of this section,  
4 the following term shall, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, have the following  
5 meaning:- “Institute of higher education”, all postsecondary institutions including: (i) the system  
6 of public institutions of higher education, established in section 5; (ii) private occupational  
7 schools, as defined in section 263 of chapter 112; and (iii) private colleges, universities and other  
8 institutions of higher learning.

9 (b) All institutes of higher education shall require students to complete a comprehensive  
10 fire safety curriculum from an expert source. The curriculum shall cover fire safety in a variety  
11 of scenarios, including, but not limited to, fire prevention and escape, what to do in case of both  
12 smoldering and flaming fires, kitchen fires, electrical fires, vehicle fires, smoke inhalation, and  
13 carbon monoxide poisoning. Students shall complete an examination to test student proficiency.

14 SECTION 2. Chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,  
15 is hereby amended by inserting after section 99 the following section:-

16 Section 100. Establishment of a fire safety curriculum. (a) For the purposes of this  
17 section, the following term shall, unless the context clearly requires otherwise, have the  
18 following meaning:- “School”, every public or private elementary and secondary school in the  
19 commonwealth; provided, however, that the term school shall not include colleges and  
20 universities.

21 (b) All schools shall require students to complete a comprehensive fire safety curriculum  
22 by the end of the 10th grade from an expert source. The curriculum shall cover fire safety in a  
23 variety of scenarios, including, but not limited to, fire prevention and escape, what to do in case  
24 of both smoldering and flaming fires, kitchen fires, electrical fires, vehicle fires, smoke  
25 inhalation, and carbon monoxide poisoning. Students shall complete an examination to test  
26 student proficiency.
