## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act to stop mass shootings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 20. No person shall, within the commonwealth, manufacture or cause to be

Chapter 269 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:--

manufactured, partially or completely, any assault weapon or large capacity feeding device as

defined in section 121 of chapter 140 of the General Laws. This prohibition shall not apply to

5 weapons or devices manufactured by a licensed manufacturer solely for the purpose of the lawful

sale to an authorized law enforcement or military agency of the commonwealth, any other state,

the United States, or a foreign government approved by the United States State Department.

Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more

than \$1,000,000 or by imprisonment for not less than one year nor more than ten years, or by

10 both such fine and imprisonment.
