In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act Protecting First Responders and Enhancing Access to Behavioral Health Centers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 231 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
2	section 85BB the following section:-

3 Section 85CC. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no duly

4 licensed or certified law enforcement officer, as defined in section 1 of chapter 6E, or

5 ambulance, emergency medical technician or other person or entity providing ambulance service

6 or emergency medical services, as those terms are defined in section 1 of chapter 111C, shall be

7 subject to any claim, liability or penalty for transporting a person to a community behavioral

8 health center, as defined in section  $13D\frac{1}{2}$  of chapter 118E.
