An Act prohibiting court ordered visitation rights to any persons convicted of criminal offenses against a minor.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 28 of Chapter 208 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:— No court shall make  
3 an order providing unsupervised visitation rights to a parent who has been convicted of sexual  
4 abuse and/or other crimes against children including but not limited to one or more of the  
5 following: Ch. 265, sections 13B, 13H, 13J, 22, 22A, 23, 24, 24B, 26, 26A, 27A, Chapter 272,  
6 sections 1, 2, 4, 4A, 4B, 16, 17, 28, 29A, 29B, 35, 35A, unless such child is of suitable age and  
7 assents to such order and a guardian ad litem finds the visitation is in the best interest of the  
8 child.

9           SECTION 2. Section 37 of Chapter 209 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
10 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:— No court shall make

11 an order providing unsupervised visitation rights to a parent who has been convicted of sexual  
12 abuse and/or other crimes against children including but not limited to one or more of the  
13 following: Ch. 265, sections 13B, 13H, 13J, 22, 22A, 23, 24, 24B, 26, 26A, 27A, Chapter 272,  
14 sections 1, 2, 4, 4A, 4B, 16, 17, 28, 29A, 29B, 35, 35A, unless such child is of suitable age and  
15 assents to such order and a guardian ad litem finds the visitation is in the best interest of the
