## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act relative to youth skin health.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 71 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by adding after section 99 the following section:-
- 3 Section 100. Any person, including but not limited to students, parents or school
- 4 personnel may possess and use a topical sunscreen product without a physician's note or
- 5 prescription while on school property or at a school-related event or activity to avoid
- 6 overexposure to the sun if the product is regulated by the Federal Food and Drug Administration
- 7 for over-the-counter use.
- 8 For the purposes of this Section only, sunscreen is not an over-the-counter medication.
- 9 Nothing in this section requires school personnel to assist pupils in applying sunscreen.
- The school district may encourage school sites to educate pupils on sun safety
- 11 precautions.
