### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act reforming the composition of the boards of registrars of voters.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 51, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition, is hereby amended by

2 striking section 18 and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

3 Section 18. In the original and in each succeeding appointment and in filling vacancies, 4 registrars of voters shall be so appointed as follows: (i) that as nearly as possible the members of 5 the board shall represent the 2 leading political parties and voters with an unenrolled designation, 6 as defined in section 1 of chapter 50 and section 38 of chapter 53; provided, that a city or town 7 clerk need not be enrolled in a political party; and (ii) that in no case shall an appointment to the 8 registrars of voters be made so as to cause the board to have more than 2 members from any 9 established political party or political designation in the Commonwealth, including the city or 10 town clerk.
