Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 62 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after

31 SECTION 4. Section 10 of Chapter 70B of the General Laws is hereby amended by32 adding the following new subsection:

33 (d) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the authority shall be authorized and 34 directed to add twenty (20) percentage points to the project reimbursement rates for regional 35 vocational-technical high school and county, regional and independent agricultural high school 36 construction so that reimbursement rates for such projects are not less than 75% nor more than 37 90% of the eligible costs. Further, the authority shall add five (5) percentage points to the 38 reimbursement rate for any project that includes state-approved vocational-technical education 39 programs as defined in Chapter 74 of the General Laws aligned with priorities specifically 40 identified in the Regional Labor Market Blueprint for the region in which the school is located. 41 However, additional percentage points shall not be awarded unless the school currently offers 42 five (5) or more Chapter 74 programs. In no case shall the total reimbursement for a project 43 exceed 90% of eligible costs.

44 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule to the contrary, the 45 office of administration and finance shall implement an incremental increase to the per-pupil 46 foundation rate for vocational and technical school students, equivalent to the inflation index.

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
