In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act to strengthen representation and promote democratic, transparent, and efficient lawmaking.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 3 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 9B, as
2	appearing in the 2022 Official Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following new section:
3	Section 9B.
4	(a) The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives shall each
5	receive for each regular annual session additional regular compensation equal to 75% of the
6	amount calculated pursuant to Article CXVIII.
7	(b) The chair of the senate committee on ways and means, the chair of the house
8	committee on ways and means, and the floor leader of each of the major political parties in the
9	senate and house of representatives shall each receive for each regular annual session additional
10	regular compensation equal to 50% of the amount calculated pursuant to Article CXVIII.
11	(c) The assistant floor leader and the second assistant floor leader of each of the major
12	political parties in the senate and house of representatives, the third assistant floor leader of the

minority party in the senate and the house of representatives, the vice chair of the senate committee on ways and means, the vice chair of the house committee on ways and means, the ranking minority member of the senate committees on ways and means, and the ranking minority member of the house committees on ways and means shall each receive for each regular annual session additional regular compensation equal to 33% of the amount calculated pursuant to Article CXVIII.

(d) The senate chair and the house chair of committees established by the joint rules of the senate and house of representatives to which more than fifty petitions are referred by the senate and the house of representatives before March 1 of the first year of a biennial session of the general court shall each receive for each regular annual session additional regular compensation equal to 33% of the amount calculated pursuant to Article CXVIII.

24 (e) Senators receiving additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (b) or (c) 25 of this section who are members of one or more committees the chairs of which are eligible to be 26 paid additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section, senators 27 receiving additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section who are 28 members of more than one committee the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional 29 regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section, and representatives receiving no 30 additional regular compensation pursuant to subsections (a), (b), (c) or (d) of this section who are 31 members of one or more committees the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional regular 32 compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section shall each receive for each regular annual 33 session additional regular compensation equal to 20% of the amount calculated pursuant to 34 Article CXVIII; provided further that senators receiving no additional regular compensation 35 pursuant to subsections (a), (b), (c) or (d) of this section who are members of more than four

36 committees the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional regular compensation pursuant 37 to subsection (d) of this section shall each receive for each regular annual session additional 38 regular compensation equal to 40% of the amount calculated pursuant to Article CXVIII; 39 provided however that no senator shall receive additional regular compensation for service in 40 more than 2 positions and no representative shall receive additional regular compensation for 41 service in more than 1 position.

42 (f) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each member of the general court shall
43 be paid that member's compensation for each session on a bi-weekly basis. Compensation shall
44 include any amounts a member is entitled to pursuant to Article CXVIII, this section, section 9C
45 or as otherwise established by law.

46 (g) Each member of the general court receiving additional regular compensation pursuant
47 to subsections (a), (b), (c) or (d) of this section shall be paid 50% of that member's additional
48 regular compensation for each session on a bi-weekly basis.

(h)(1) Upon certification by the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives pursuant to subsection (i)(1) of this section, each member of the general court receiving additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section shall be paid 50% of that member's additional regular compensation for the first year of a biennial session of the general court in the last bi-weekly payment in such year.

(2) Upon certification by the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of
representatives pursuant to subsection (i)(2) of this section, each member of the general court
receiving additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section shall be paid

57 50% of that member's additional regular compensation for the second year of a biennial session
58 of the general court in the last bi-weekly payment in such year.

59 (i)(1) On the third Monday in December of the first year of a biennial session of the 60 general court, the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives shall jointly 61 examine the records of each committee the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional 62 regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section. For each such committee, if the 63 records document that as of that date the committee has held a public hearing and a public mark-64 up session on each bill referred to it before November 1 of such year and that every report filed 65 by the committee has been approved by a vote of a majority of the members of the committee at 66 a public meeting at which a quorum was present, the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the 67 house of representatives shall so certify jointly. Such certification shall constitute the 68 certification required pursuant to subsection (h)(1) of this section to pay additional regular 69 compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section.

70 (2) On the last Friday in May of the second year of a biennial session of the general court, 71 the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives shall jointly examine the 72 records of committees the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional regular compensation 73 pursuant to subsection (d) of this section. For each such committee, if the records document that 74 the committee has held a public hearing and a public mark-up session on each bill referred to it 75 before April 15 of such year and has filed a report on each such bill approved by a vote of a 76 majority of the members of the committee at a public meeting at which a quorum was present, 77 the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives shall so certify jointly. Such 78 certification shall constitute the certification required pursuant to subsection (h)(2) of this section 79 to pay additional regular compensation pursuant to subsection (d) of this section.

80 (3) On each of the dates specified in subsections (i)(1) and (i)(2) of this section, the clerk 81 of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives shall calculate a compliance rate for 82 each of the first year and the second year of a biennial session of the general court. For purposes 83 of this subsection, the compliance rate for each such year is defined as the percentage of 84 committees the chairs of which are eligible to be paid additional regular compensation pursuant 85 to subsection (d) of this section for which the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of 86 representatives have issued a certification for such year pursuant to subsection (h)(1) or (h)(2) of 87 this section.

(j) Each member of the general court receiving additional regular compensation pursuant
to subsections (a), (b) or (c) of this section shall be paid in the last bi-weekly payment in each
regular annual session the percentage of that member's additional regular compensation for each
session equal to 50% multiplied by the compliance rate as defined in subsection (i)(3) of this
section.

(k) Each member of the general court who serves in a position for which additional
regular compensation is paid pursuant to this section for a period less than an entire biennial
session of the general court shall receive such additional regular compensation prorated for the
time of that person's service in that position.
