In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act expanding the senior property tax exemption.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 59, Section 5, subsection 41C is hereby amended by striking out

2 the words:

3	"A city, by vote of its council and approval of its mayor, or a town, by vote of town
4	meeting, may adjust the following factors contained in these provisions by: 1) reducing the
5	requisite age of eligibility to any person age 65 years or older; 2) increasing either or both of the
6	amounts contained in the first sentence of this clause, by not more than 100 per cent;" and
7	replacing with the following new text:
8	"A city, by vote of its council and approval of its mayor, or a town, by vote of town

9 meeting, may adjust the following factors contained in these provisions by: 1) reducing the
10 requisite age of eligibility to any person age 65 years or older; 2) increasing either or both of the

- 11 amounts contained in the first sentence of this clause, by not more than 100 per cent, or
- 12 increasing the \$500 exemption in the first sentence up to \$2,000;"
