In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act relative to AEDs for athletic fields.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 45 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following

2 section:-

3 Section 26. (a) Each municipality shall provide and maintain at least 1 automated external 4 defibrillator, AED, at each athletic field, park and playground that is maintained by the 5 municipality. The parks and recreation department of a municipality may, at its discretion, 6 require additional AEDs be provided and maintained by the municipality at any athletic field, 7 park or playground that is maintained by the municipality. 8 (b) Any municipality that is required to provide and maintain an AED pursuant to 9 subsection (a) shall provide mandatory training on cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of 10 AEDs to: all staff employed by its parks and recreation department; all sports coaches, umpires,

11 referees and other sports officials who participate in athletic events held at athletic fields, parks

or playgrounds maintained by the municipality; and any other group as determined by the parksand recreation department of the municipality.

(c) The parks and recreation department of each municipality subject to this section may
 contract on behalf of the municipality for the procurement of AEDs and the mandatory training
 on cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of AEDs required by subsection (b).

SECTION 2. Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
54C and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

19 Section 54C. (a) Each school district, vocational district, charter school, approved private 20 day or residential school and collaborative school shall provide and maintain at least 1 automated 21 external defibrillator, AED, on site at each school facility where instruction is provided. Each 22 school shall have on staff a person who is an AED provider having current certification in a 23 training course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and in the use of an AED in accordance with 24 the standards established by the American Heart Association or the American National Red 25 Cross.

(b) Each school district, vocational district, charter school, approved private day or
residential school and collaborative school that maintains athletic fields for use in schoolsponsored athletic events shall provide and maintain at least 1 AED in the area of the athletic
fields. The school administration shall ensure that an AED provider is readily available at any
school-sponsored athletic event.

31 (c) Any school system that is required to provide and maintain an AED pursuant to
32 subsections (a) and (b) shall provide mandatory training on cardiopulmonary resuscitation and
33 the use of AEDs to all staff employed by the school system, including sports coaches.

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34 (d) If a school system is unable to comply with the requirements of this section, the 35 superintendent of the school district, the administration of a private day or residential school or 36 the board of trustees of a charter school, shall request a hardship waiver from the department of 37 elementary and secondary education. The department of elementary and secondary education, in 38 consultation with the department of public health, shall make available to public schools a list of 39 grants and other funding sources that a public school may access to facilitate the purchase of 40 AEDs.

41 (e) Any school staff member who, in good faith, attempts to render emergency care,
42 including cardiopulmonary resuscitation or defibrillation, and does so without compensation,
43 shall not be liable

for acts or omissions, other than gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct,
resulting from the attempt to render such emergency care.

46 (f) The department of elementary and secondary education, in consultation with the
47 department of public health, shall establish regulations and guidelines for the implementation,
48 training, support and supervision of this section.
