The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act to establish an acquired brain injury advisory board.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. An acquired brain injury advisory board shall be established to collaborate

with appropriate state secretariats and their agencies, members of the legislature, individuals with

3 acquired brain injuries and their family members, providers, clinicians, advocacy groups and

other key stakeholders to review, advise, and report on services and supports, and public policy

5 there under for individuals with acquired brain injuries and their families.

6 SECTION 2. Said advisory board shall consist of 2 members of the Senate, 1 of whom

shall be appointed by the President, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Minority Leader; 2

8 members of the House of Representatives, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker, 1 of

9 whom shall be appointed by the Minority Leader; the Secretary of Health and Human Services or

10 their designee; the Secretary of the Executive Office of Public Safety or their designee; the Secretary of Elder Affairs or their designee; the Secretary of Veterans Services or their designee; 12 the Commissioner of the Department of Public Health or their designee; 2 members from the 13 MassAbility, 1 who shall be the Commissioner or their designee, 1 who shall be appointed by the 14 Commissioner; the Commissioner of the Department of Developmental Services or their 15 designee; the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health or their designee; 2 members of 16 the MassHealth, 1 who shall be the Director or their designee, and 1 who shall be the Director of 17 Home and Community-Based Services Waiver Administration or their designee; the 18 Commissioner of the Division of Insurance or their designee, the Executive Director of the 19 Center for Health Information and Analysis (CHIA) or their designee, the Chief Executive 20 Officer at the Brain Injury Association of Massachusetts, Inc. or their designee; and 8 members who shall be appointed by the Governor, 2 of whom shall be family members, caretakers or 22 significant others of a person with acquired brain injury, 2 of whom shall be individuals with 23 acquired brain injury, including but not limited to individuals who have experienced traumatic 24 brain injury, stroke, brain tumors or other disorders, 1 of whom shall be a community based 25 provider of services to individuals with acquired brain injury 1 of whom shall be a community 26 based provider of services to individuals with acquired brain injury serving minorities and other 27 underserved populations, 1 of whom shall be from a disability advisory group or a protection and 28 advocacy representative, 1 of whom shall be a clinician.

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SECTION 3. Said advisory board directives shall include, but are not limited to, reviewing data concerning the epidemiology of acquired brain injury and the needs of individuals with acquired brain injury and their families; reviewing efforts to increase access to rehabilitative, residential and integrated community based support services for persons with

acquired brain injury; monitoring the implementation of the acquired brain injury commission recommendations regarding the improvement of such services; and reviewing ongoing state public policy initiatives and state funding.

SECTION 4. Said advisory board shall file a biennial report with the Governor, the Secretary of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services, the Senate President, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives. Said report shall include but not be limited to a summary of ongoing needs of individuals with acquired brain injury, the status of progress made in increasing access to rehabilitative, residential and integrated community-based support services for individuals with acquired brain injury; and the status of progress made in implementing the acquired brain injury commission recommendations regarding the improvement of such services.

SECTION 5. Said advisory board shall meet quarterly, at minimum, and may establish subcommittees as necessary to carry out its objectives.
