**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court  
(2025-2026)**

An Act increasing access to ABA services by recognizing assistant level providers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 10H of Chapter 118E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraphs:-

3 “The division shall establish a rate for applied behavior analysis services for all providers  
4 who are licensed to provide said services by the Board of Registration of Allied Mental Health  
5 and Human Services Professions of the Department of Public Health.

6 The division shall adopt reimbursement codes and modifiers as necessary so that all  
7 licensed providers of applied behavioral analysis, as established by the Board of Registration of  
8 Allied Mental Health and Human Services Professions of the Department of Public Health, may  
9 be eligible to submit for reimbursement from the division, its contracted health insurers, health  
10 plans, health maintenance organizations, behavioral health management firms and third party  
11 administrator.”
