Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 126 of the acts of 2022, is

- hereby amended in section 51L, by inserting after subsection (c), the following subsection:-
- 3 (d) The department shall make an annual report of its doings under this section,
- 4 including, but not limited to: (i) the current state of pre-hospital care protocols and point-of-entry
- 5 plans to ensure stroke patients are transported to the most appropriate facility; (ii) an overview of
- 6 the work done by the task force established in subsection (c); (iii) the number of suspected stroke
- 7 patients transported directly to a designated stroke facility and the time required to arrive; (iv)
- 8 the number of suspected stroke patients transported to a hospital then discharged to a designated
- 9 stroke facility and the time required to arrive. Said report shall be filed with the clerks of the
