**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act relative to maintenance of physical examinations records for public safety personnel.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 94 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following words:-

3 If the member’s employer failed to maintain a record of the member’s physical
4 examination on entry into service, the member or employer may submit an affidavit attesting that
5 the member did undergo such an examination and that the examination failed to reveal evidence
6 of such condition. This affidavit shall constitute satisfactory evidence that the member
7 underwent such a physical.

8 SECTION 2. Section 94A of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
9 amended by adding the following words:-

10 If the member's employer failed to maintain a record of the member's physical
11 examination on entry into service, the member or employer may submit an affidavit attesting that
12 the member did undergo such an examination and that the examination failed to reveal evidence
13 of such condition. This affidavit shall constitute satisfactory evidence that the member
14 underwent such a physical.

15 SECTION 3. Section 94B(1) of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is
16 hereby amended by adding the following words:-

17 If the member's employer failed to maintain a record of the member's physical
18 examination on entry into service, the member or employer may submit an affidavit attesting that
19 the member did undergo such an examination and that the examination failed to reveal evidence
20 of such condition. This affidavit shall constitute satisfactory evidence that the member
21 underwent such a physical.
