**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act exempting residential electric vehicle chargers from the sales tax.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter 64H, as so appearing in the 2022 Official Edition of the
2 General Laws, is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:-

3 (yy) Sales of electric vehicle supply equipment, as defined in section 2 of chapter 25B, or
4 individual replacement components of electric vehicle supply equipment, installed in or on
5 residences.

6 SECTION 2. Subsection (yy) of said section 6 of said chapter 64H is hereby repealed.

7 SECTION 3. Section 2 of this act shall take effect on January 1, 2030.
