An Act relative to a healthier, stronger Massachusetts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The department of public health shall design and implement a public  
2 awareness campaign, subject to appropriation, to promote healthy and active lifestyles. The  
3 campaign shall promote subjects including, but not limited to, safe and responsible approaches to  
4 exercise in gyms and indoor or outdoor exercise facilities and healthy habits to improve immune,  
5 respiratory, and other systems of the body to support disease prevention. Promotion methods  
6 shall include, but not be limited to, television and website advertisements, infographic displays in  
7 public places, and the adoption of a memorable slogan.

8           SECTION 2. The department of public health shall establish and set up on the books of  
9 the Commonwealth a gym membership subsidy program for the purpose of incentivizing public  
10 and private employers to offer free gym memberships for employees. The department shall  
11 design and implement an application system whereby employers may apply for partial or full  
12 reimbursement for the costs of offering employees free gym memberships. The department  
13 acting under such program shall prioritize applicants who do not contract with a health insurance  
14 provider that offers gym membership reimbursements.
