Keenan for legislation to prevent fires and secondhand smoke in non-smoking rental housing; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1140) of Edward J. Kennedy for legislation to establish a foreclosure review division; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1142) of Edward J. Kennedy for legislation to restore a lower threshold for permit challenges in court decisions; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1149) of Jason M. Mark for legislation to prohibit injurious operations or offering services or products that discriminate against or injure protected classes; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1176) of Paul W. Mark and Michael O. Moore for legislation to remove the 3-day commitment period to a facility for a person with a mental illness; and (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2446) of Bruce E. Tarr for legislation to promote motor vehicle safety and habitual offenders, report the accompanying Order (Senate, No. 2930).
