McKenna and others for legislation relative to the retirement of state university and community college police officers; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1843) of Ryan C. Fattman for legislation to designate certain unit 9 employees of the Massachusetts Department of Correction to be in Group 2 of the contributory retirement system; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1866) of Barry R. Finegold for legislation to clarify Group 4 retirement classification eligibility for utility maintenance workers; (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1894) of Patrick M.
