An Act authorizing the city of Greenfield to grant an additional liquor license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. (a) Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
2 licensing authority of the city of Greenfield may grant 1 additional license for the sale of all
3 alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138 to the
4 Bear's Den and Gleason Ventures LLC, located at 5 Bank Row, in the city of Greenfield. The
5 license granted pursuant to this section shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except said
6 section 17.

7 (b) A license granted under this section shall only be exercised in the dining room of a
8 common victualler and such other public rooms or areas as may be deemed reasonable and
9 appropriate by the licensing authority as certified in writing.

10 (c) The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license granted pursuant
11 to this act to any other location, but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same
12 location if the applicant files with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue
13 and a letter from the department of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in
14 good standing with those departments and that all applicable taxes, fees and contributions have
15 been paid.

16 (d) If a licensee terminates or fails to renew a license granted under this section or any
17 such license is canceled, revoked or no longer in use, it shall be returned physically, with all of
18 the legal rights, privileges and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority which
19 may, within 1 year after such return, then grant the license to a new applicant at the same
20 location and under the same conditions as specified in this section, otherwise such license shall
21 dissolve.

22 (e) The license granted under this act shall be issued within 1 year after the effective date
23 of this act; provided, however, that if the license is originally granted within that time period, it
24 may be granted to a new applicant under subsections (c) and (d) thereafter.

25 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
