**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court
(2025-2026)**

An Act promoting educational awareness and opportunity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 44 the following new section:-

3 Section 44 1/2. Any public institution of higher education as defined in Section 5 shall
4 be required to collect and provide to all students, when applying for or changing their major field
5 of study, the following information: (i) The estimated cost in total for the selected major when
6 taking the required courses to complete such major; (ii) the average amount of debt students who
7 have completed a degree in such major in the past three years have acquired upon graduation for
8 the chosen major; (iii) the professions that recent graduates within the major have acquired,
9 within 1 year of graduation, including the number who have not received jobs and have not

- 10 continued on to higher education programs; and (iv) the average salary of recent graduates,
- 11 within 3 years, with the major.
