An Act establishing a local option for freezing property tax appraisals.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 59 of the General Laws, as appearin	ing in the 2022 Official Edition, is hereby
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2 amended by inserting after section 50 the following section:-

3 Section 5P. Local Option Property Appraisal Freeze.

4 (a) A city or town that accepts this section in the manner provided in section 4 of chapter

5 4 may establish a local option policy to freeze property tax assessments at the current assessed

6 value for eligible residential properties.

(b) The appraisal freeze shall apply to properties that meet eligibility criteria established
by the municipality, which may include: (1) Owner-occupied primary residences; (2) Elderly
persons, as defined in section 14 of chapter 19A; (3) Veterans as defined in section 1 of chapter
115; or (4) Other categories as determined by the municipality.

(c) The freeze shall remain in effect for a period determined by the municipality, not to
exceed 3 years, and may be renewed upon a majority vote of the legislative body of the city or
town.

- (d) Properties benefiting from the appraisal freeze shall remain subject to adjustments for
 improvements, renovations, or expansions that increase property value.
- (e) The commissioner of revenue shall promulgate regulations necessary for the
 implementation of this section, including guidelines for administration, public notification, and
 annual reporting by local assessors.
