## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Fourth General Court (2025-2026)

An Act providing municipalities to opt out of fluoridation treatments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. Section 8C of Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022
2	Official Edition, are hereby amended by inserting the following new paragraph after line 46:
3	Any town, city or district with artificial fluoridation programs in effect can end those
4	programs with a local ordinance banning fluoridation via the local legislative body, i.e. City
5	Council, Town Meeting or Water Commissioners. That process is initiated by the presentation of
6	a petition of at least ten registered voters to the legislative body. Moreover, if the water
7	superintendent or water commissioners with responsibility for ensuring water safety determines
8	that in their opinion, the water fluoridation program is posing a risk to consumers, workers,
9	infrastructure or environment, they can suspend fluoridation programs at will.
