Pursuant to G.L. c. 272, § 99R, I hereby submit this report to the General Court on behalf of the Attorney General's Office for the 2025 calendar year.


During 2025, the Attorney General submitted two (2) applications for electronic surveillance warrants to Justices of the Superior Court. The Attorney General submitted (6) subsequent applications for renewal. All the applications for electronic surveillance were granted by Justices of the Superior Court. The resulting warrants authorized electronic surveillance for up to fifteen days. The designated offenses for which electronic surveillance was conducted included violations of: G.L. c. 94C, §§ 32A, 32E, 34, 40; G.L. c. 265 § 25; G.L. c. 271, §§ 16A, 17; and G.L. c. 274, § 7.

During 2025, a total of 30,712 interceptions were made pursuant to these warrants. As a result, 139 indictments were issued.

In 2025, there were no jury trials that included the presentation of electronic surveillance; therefore, there were no convictions resulting from wiretap warrants.
