Enclosed is the Legislative Report for the Children's Medical Security Plan (CMSP) for the second quarter of Fiscal Year 2025. The report covers October 1, 2024– December 31, 2024.

The information provided in the report includes the same data provided in the past (such as eligibility and program expenditures).

At the end of the second quarter of FY 2025 (December 31, 2024), there were 87,730 children eligible for CMSP. CMSP eligibility does not indicate that an eligible member is using CMSP services. Additional information on CMSP utilization can be found in the attached report.

The Children’s Medical Security Plan Legislative Report FY 2025– 2nd QUARTER

Reporting Period October 1, 2024– December 31, 2024

The Children’s Medical Security Plan provides access to primary and preventive health care services to certain children and adolescents. Children from birth to age 18 are eligible for CMSP provided they are not eligible for other MassHealth benefits (except MassHealth Limited) and provided that they are not otherwise insured.

Effective January 1, 2025, enrollee premiums were set at zero for those enrollees whose income is up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), and premiums are set via a sliding scale for enrollees with incomes greater than 300% of the FPL. In addition, all copayments were eliminated for CMSP members effective January 1, 2025.

Enrollment Demographics

At the end of the second quarter of FY 2025, there were 87,730 children eligible for CMSP. CMSP eligibility does not indicate that an eligible member is using CMSP services, additional information on CMSP utilization can be found below.

Total Expenditures

The number of claims filed for CMSP for the second quarter of Fiscal Year FY 2025 totaled 185,805. There were 113,867 medical claims, 61,503 dental claims, and 10,435 pharmacy claims filed during the second quarter of the fiscal year. Total expenditures for the second quarter of the Fiscal Year 2025 were \$11,729,120.
