Enclosed is the Legislative Report for the Children's Medical Security Plan (CMSP) for the third quarter of Fiscal Year 2025. The report covers January 1, 2025– March 31, 2025.

The Children’s Medical Security Plan Legislative Report FY 2025– 3rd QUARTER

Reporting Period January 1, 2025– March 31, 2025

The Children’s Medical Security Plan provides access to primary and preventive health care services to certain children and adolescents. Children from birth to age 18 are eligible for CMSP provided they are not eligible for other MassHealth benefits (except MassHealth Limited), and provided that they are not otherwise insured.

Effective January 1, 2025, enrollee premiums were set at zero for those enrollees whose income is up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), and premiums are set via a sliding scale for enrollees with incomes greater than 300% of the FPL. In addition, all copayments were eliminated for CMSP members effective January 1, 2025.

Enrollment Demographics

At the end of the third quarter of FY 2025, there were 83,451 children eligible for CMSP. CMSP eligibility does not indicate that an eligible member is using CMSP services. Additional information on CMSP utilization can be found below.

Total Expenditures

The number of claims filed for CMSP for the third quarter of Fiscal Year FY 2025 totaled 184,310. There were 118,638 medical claims, 55,106 dental claims, and 10,566 pharmacy claims filed during the third quarter of the fiscal year. Total expenditures for the third quarter of the Fiscal Year 2025 were \$11,749,929.40.
