Enclosed is the Legislative Report for the Children's Medical Security Plan (CMSP) for the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2025. The report covers April 1, 2025– June 30, 2025.

The Children's Medical Security Plan Legislative Report FY 2025– 4th QUARTER

Reporting Period April 1, 2025– June 30, 2025

The Children's Medical Security Plan provides access to primary and preventive health care services to certain children and adolescents. Children from birth to age 18 are eligible for CMSP provided they are not eligible for other MassHealth benefits (except MassHealth Limited), and provided that they are not otherwise insured.

Effective January 1, 2025, enrollee premiums were set at zero for those enrollees whose income is up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), and premiums are set via a sliding scale for enrollees with incomes greater than 300% of the FPL. In addition, all copayments were eliminated for CMSP members effective January 1, 2025.

Enrollment Demographics

At the end of the fourth quarter of FY 2025, there were 85,222 children eligible for CMSP. CMSP eligibility does not indicate that an eligible member is using CMSP services. Additional information on CMSP utilization can be found below.

Total Expenditures

The number of claims filed for CMSP for the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2025 totaled 148,820. There were 105,562 medical claims, 32,459 dental claims, and 10,799 pharmacy claims filed during the fourth quarter of the fiscal year. Total expenditures for the fourth quarter of the Fiscal Year 2025 were \$10,025,194.
