Re: MassHealth Report on Safety Net Provider Payment (SNPP) Trust Fund Accounting

Dear Chairs Rodrigues and Michlewitz:

Section 2AAAAA of Chapter 29 of the Massachusetts General Laws requires that the executive office of health and human services report to you with an accounting of money received by the Safety Net Provider Payment (SNPP) Trust Fund and the sources of that money, an accounting of payments made to providers broken down by amounts paid per provider and the authorization for the payments, the amount of any expended balance, and projected revenue and spending amounts for the current year.

The SNPP trust fund received total revenue of \$278.4M for FY2025. Of this amount, \$127.6M was generated from the Health Safety Net Assessment, \$17.3M from the Office of the Comptroller 2E Transfer and \$144.2M from Federal Funds Participation. The Prior Year Roll-In and Current Year Rollover resulted in a net reduction of \$10.8M.

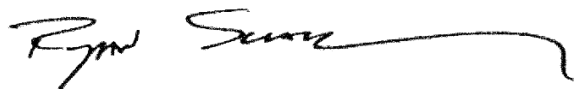
Total Expenditures for the period amounted to \$274.9M. The difference between the expenditure amount and the payments to providers in the table below is attributable to a \$10.1M prepayment made in 2024. After accounting for this adjustment, the fund ended the period with an unexpended balance of \$3.5M. Authorization for these expenditures is included under the 1115 Waiver.

For fiscal year 2025, the projected revenue is \$337.3M, and projected spending is \$246.6M. An itemized breakdown of provider payments for each provider for the period July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 is provided in the section that follows.
