## AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SOUTHBRIDGE TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN SPECIAL FUNDS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1       **SECTION 1.** Notwithstanding section 53 of chapter 44 of the General Laws or any other  
2       general or special law to the contrary, the town of Southbridge may establish a fund in  
3       the town treasury, to be known as the Landfill Royalty Fund, into which shall be  
4       deposited all royalty payments received from the private operator of the town owned  
5       Barefoot Road Sanitary Landfill pursuant to the “Extension of Agreement for the  
6       Operation of the Barefoot Road Sanitary Landfill, and Refuse and Recyclables  
7       Collection, in the town of Southbridge, by and between Southbridge Recycling &  
8       Disposal Park, Inc., and the town of Southbridge, dated May 29, 2007), on file with the  
9       town clerk, or, if said agreement expires, is sooner superseded or otherwise becomes  
10      inapplicable, then pursuant to any successor agreement with any private landfill operator  
11      relative to the operation of said landfill.

12      The town council may, by majority vote, appropriate no more than 50 per cent of the  
13      estimated annual landfill royalty payment to be received in any fiscal year under the  
14      landfill extension agreement or other successor landfill operating agreement in order to  
15      fund the operating budget of the town. The remaining 50 per cent of the estimated annual  
16      landfill royalty payment and any balance remaining in the Landfill Royalty Fund may be  
17      appropriated at any time by a two-thirds vote, to fund capital projects or for any lawful  
18      purpose, including, but not limited to, additional funding for the town’s operating budget.  
19      The town council may appropriate or transfer additional money into the Landfill Royalty  
20      Fund at any time. If in any fiscal year the amounts appropriated by the town pursuant to  
21      this section exceed the landfill royalty payments actually received, the town council shall  
22      raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds sufficient amounts to address the  
23      deficit prior to the end of that fiscal year, or the deficit shall be added to the tax levy and  
24      raised by taxation in the fiscal year immediately following.

25           **SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding section 53 of chapter 44 of the General Laws or any other  
26 general or special law to the contrary, the town of Southbridge may establish a fund in  
27 the town treasury, to be known as the Landfill Reimbursement Fund, into which shall be  
28 deposited all reimbursements and other payments, except the royalty payment referred to  
29 in section 1, received under the extension agreement, any successor landfill operating  
30 agreement, any landfill site assignment, or modification thereof, issued by the board of  
31 health in the town of Southbridge pursuant to section 150A of chapter 111 of the General  
32 Laws, or under any other agreement relative to the operation of the landfill. The town  
33 council may, by majority vote, appropriate estimated reimbursements and other landfill  
34 related payments to be received in any fiscal year under the landfill extension agreement,  
35 any successor landfill operating agreement, any landfill site assignment, or modification  
36 thereof, issued by said board of health pursuant to said section 150A, or any other  
37 agreement relative to the operation of said landfill, as may be necessary to fund the  
38 various activities for which such payments are made, or may appropriate said funds for  
39 any other lawful purpose. If in any fiscal year the amount appropriated by the town  
40 pursuant to this section exceeds the landfill reimbursement payments or other landfill-  
41 related payments actually received, the town council shall raise and appropriate or  
42 transfer from available funds sufficient amounts to address the deficit prior to the end of  
43 that fiscal year, or the deficit shall be added to the tax levy and raised by taxation in the  
44 fiscal year immediately following.

45           **SECTION 3.** The town treasurer shall be the custodian of the Landfill Royalty Fund and  
46 the Landfill Reimbursement Fund and shall make a separate accounting of each special  
47 fund to the town council each year no later than September 1<sup>st</sup> for the preceding fiscal  
48 year ending on June 30th. Any income derived from the investment or reinvestment of  
49 the special funds authorized herein shall remain with and become part of each fund.

50           **SECTION 4.** Chapter 475 of the acts of 2004 is hereby repealed.

51           **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect upon its passage.
