forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the department of developmental services, therefore
it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
convenience. , therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, the department of
2 developmental services shall establish a sick leave bank for Susan Harper, an employee of the
3 department. Any employee of the department may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal or
4 vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Susan Harper. Whenever Susan Harper terminates
5 employment with the department or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the
6 sick leave bank shall be transferred to the extended illness leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not
7 used for absences unrelated to the disability or illness that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave
8 bank as determined by the department.
