The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to protect trees in public parks.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 266 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 98A, as
2 appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

3 Section98A. Whoever willfully, intentionally and without right, or wantonly and without
4 cause destroys, defaces, mars or injures any playground apparatus, equipment, trees or native
5 flora, located in a public park or playground shall be punished by a fine or not more than \$2,000.
