An Act to continue the provision of supplemental health insurance to municipal employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1.

2 Section 19 of Chapter 32B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
3 Edition, is hereby amended by striking the third sentence of subsection (e) thereof and replacing
4 it with the following sentence:-

5 On the effective date of the transfer, the health insurance of all subscribers, including
6 elderly governmental retirees previously governed by section 10B of chapter 32A and retired
7 municipal teachers previously governed by section 12 of chapter 32A, shall be provided through
8 the commission for all purposes and governed under this section, except as set forth in subsection
9 (j).

10 SECTION 2.

11 Section 19 of Chapter 32B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
12 Edition, is hereby further amended by inserting after subsection (i) the following new
13 subsection:-

14 (j) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary or the transfer by a political
15 subdivision of its subscribers to the commission under subsection (e), a political subdivision
16 shall retain the authority provided by this chapter to contract with one or more insurance carriers
17 for the provision of policies of supplemental health insurance to reduce the exposure of its
18 subscribers to out-of-pocket costs related to hospital and medical expenses covered by group or
19 blanket insurance policies. Coverage under such supplemental health insurance policies shall be
20 made available at the option of said subscribers and the premium for such coverage shall be paid
21 exclusively by the subscribers, provided that the political subdivision is authorized to enter into
22 such agreements as may be necessary with any carrier or third party administrator for the
23 payment of such premium by means of payroll deduction and for the provision of administrative
24 services in connection with such insurance.
