By Mr. Lewis of Winchester, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Jason M. Lewis and others for legislation to authorize municipalities to create stabilization funds for special education costs. Municipalities and Regional Government.

### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act Supporting Municipal Fiscal Stability through a Special Education Stabilization Fund.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 5B of Chapter 40 of the General Laws (2008 Official Edition) shall be amended by adding the following paragraph:
- Upon the recommendation of the school committee and the acceptance by majority vote of the appropriate legislative body, the school department of any school district shall be
- 5 authorized to retain any unexpended funds of the present fiscal year so voted, to be placed in a
- 6 separate stabilization fund to be utilized in the upcoming fiscal year or years, to pay, without
- 7 further appropriation, for unanticipated and/or unbudgeted costs of special education out of
- 8 school district tuition and/or transportation. The balance in such separate stabilization fund shall
- 9 not exceed 2% of the annual net school spending of the school district.
