### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act eliminating the gasoline tax to state agencies and municipalities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 64A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- Any sale of fuel by a distributor to the commonwealth, any state agency or any
- 4 municipality or its agencies shall be exempt from the tax per gallon contained in this chapter.
