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**In the Year Two Thousand Eleven**  
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An Act relating to training for certified nurses' aides and direct care workers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1                   Section 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 official  
2 edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 4O the following new section:-

3                   4P. The Department shall, subject to appropriation, establish a scholarship  
4 program for certified nurses' aide and direct care worker training. The department shall establish  
5 appropriate guidelines and application criteria for the administration of the program. The  
6 scholarships shall cover the full cost of tuition to an approved certified nurses' aide or long-term  
7 care direct worker training program, including approved programs providing for cross-training.  
8 Funds may also be available to provide adult basic education and English as a second language  
9 training for applicants otherwise meeting criteria for the scholarships, as well as pilot training  
10 programs using enhanced curricula designed to support increased retention. The department  
11 shall, in consultation with the nursing home industry, consumer groups, the department of labor

12 and workforce development, the Commonwealth Corporation, training providers and other  
13 appropriate state and local agencies, conduct outreach regarding the availability of such  
14 scholarships. The department shall consult with the scholarship program advisory council to  
15 review and recommend new training requirements for certified nurses' aides, home health aides  
16 and home care workers to improve the quality of the direct care workforce and the quality of care  
17 provided in all long-term care settings by developing skill standards, supporting the transition  
18 from training to work, improving retention, promoting portability, recognizing career  
19 advancement curricula and addressing language and education barriers. The costs for outreach  
20 activities shall not exceed 3 per cent of the amount of the program and administrative costs of the  
21 program shall not exceed 3 per cent of the amount of the program.
