CURRENT LAW:	<p>Section 1 of Chapter 94C defines “counterfeit substance” as a substance which is represented to be a particular controlled drug or substance but is not in fact that drug or substance. It defines “controlled substance” as a drug, substance, controlled substance analogue or immediate precursor in any schedule or class referred in the chapter.</p> <p>Section 32G Chapter 94C of the General Law prohibits the knowing or intentional creation, possession with intent to distribute and distribution of a counterfeit substance punished by incarceration for up to 1 year or a fine between \$250 and \$2,500, or both.</p> <p>Section 32I of Chapter 94C prohibits the sale, manufacture, and possession of drug paraphernalia which is defined in Section 1 as all equipment, products, devices and materials of any kind primarily used or designed for use with a controlled substance.</p>
BILL SUMMARY:	<p>Section 1 – Adds a new subsection to Section 32G prohibiting the possession, transfer or transport of a tableting machine, an encapsulating machine or controlled substance counterfeiting materials with the knowledge, intent or reasonable cause to believe it will be used to manufacture a controlled substance or counterfeit controlled substance. A violation is punished by a \$25,000 fine or 1 to 5 years incarceration, or both.</p>
