TITLE: An Act prohibiting child sex dolls.

CURRENT LAW: Section 29A of Chapter 272 of the General Laws prohibits a person with lascivious intent from soliciting, using or permitting a child they knows or have reason to know is under 18 to pose or be exhibited in a state of nudity or to participate in any act that depicts or represents sexual conduct for the purpose of representation or reproduction in any visual material punishable by 10 to 20 years in prison or a fine of \$10,000 to \$50,000, or both.

BILL SUMMARY: Section 1 – Adds a new Section 108 to Chapter 272 criminalizing the use, possession, purchase, sale, transport, delivery, or distribution of a child sex doll. Punishment for a first offense includes a fine of up to \$10,000, imprisonment for up to 5 years, or both. Subsequent offenses carry a fine of up to \$10,000, a prison sentence of up to 10 years, or both. Defines a “child sex doll” as an anatomically correct doll, mannequin or robot, with the features that resemble those of a minor for use in sexual acts.
